1.0 CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Michael Makio at 3:40 and roll call was

conducted.

2.0 APPROVAL OF MINUTES (7/11/12)

The Board reviewed the minutes from the July 11, 2012 meeting.

Motion

With no changes, Marilyn Salas motioned to approve the minutes as read.

The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo.

With no further discussion the minutes were unanimously approved.

#### 3.0 OLD BUSINESS

#### 3.1. Desk Audit

Joe Quinata reported Pacific Human Resources is finalizing their audit and will submit their report next Monday. The report will be delivered to the Task Force Committee. Joe Quinata will schedule the meeting to accommodate the committee members. After the presentation, action may be taken at the next scheduled Board meeting.

#### 3.2. Guam Micronesian Island Fair – Guam Visitors Bureau (GVB)

Chairman Makio reported a request was received from GVB to sponsor the 2012 Guam Micronesian Island Fair (GMIF).

The Chair opened the floor for the discussion.

The Board discussed GPT past support as a bronze sponsor for the event.

Motion

With no further discussion, Marilyn Salas motioned to approve funding \$5000.00 as a bronze sponsor for the Guam Micronesian Island Fair. The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo.

With no further discussion, the motion unanimously carried.

#### 3.3. Five Year Strategic Plan

Joe Quinata presented the committee report.

The methodology to be used in this year's Strategic Plan is called "Appreciative Inquiry" which is based on the premise that "organizations change in the direction which they inquire."

The method is a three step process. The first step is the establishment of the GPT Strategic Plan Advisory Groups consisting of stakeholders that are technical, professional, and mostly champions in their respective preservation fields; the second step is creating a Venue for a symposium of preservation stakeholders; and third is empowering the Trust to Design the Plan.

A proposed timeline was presented with a targeted unveiling of November 2012. The Board discussed the scheduling of stakeholders meetings, the participation of the stakeholders, and circulating the results of the strategic plans of the previous year. The Board recommended establishing the rules for focus groups in during both the advisory group and symposium sessions. This will control the flow of open forum discussions, equal speaking time, and avoiding any grandstanding. The Board recommended postponing the dates presented in the proposed schedule.

#### Motion

With no further discussion, Marilyn Salas motioned to approve the method and the budget of \$12,250.00, to conduct the five year strategic plan. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Stephenson.

The Chairman noted the dates will be adjusted from the proposed timeline and requested that staff provide information of the accomplishments and on-going programs resulting from the previous strategic plan.

With no further discussion, the motion was unanimously approved.

#### 4.0 NEW BUSINESS

#### 4.1. FY13 Administrative/Operations Budget

Michael Makio presented the committee report.

A comparative summary of the previous FY 09-12 and the proposed FY13 budget were reviewed. The committee recommended approving the proposed FY13 budget.

The committee further recommended lifting the moratorium after the strategic plan is approved. The intent of the moratorium was to enable GPT to build up the fund. This resulted in a larger number of micro grant submissions.

The committee made no changes on personnel salaries or benefits.

Any adjustments will be addressed after the completion of the desk audit. Options for alternative compensation by increasing fringe benefits were discussed (i.e., vacation days, life insurance policies, SIRA employer contribution, etc.).

The travel budget decreased in comparison to previous years.

All other areas were essentially the same from the prior years.

The committee recommends approving the proposed FY13 budget. The overall budget is approximately \$40,000 less than FY12 Budget.

#### Motion

With no further discussion, Michael Makio motioned to approve the FY13 budget of \$495,025.81. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Stephenson. With no objections, the motion unanimously carried.

#### 4.2. Congressional Office, Dept. of Interior, Office of Insular Affairs

Ratify Motion to authorize the Chief Program Officer to work collaboratively with the Guam Congressional Office and the Dept. of Interior, Office of Insular Affairs to receive funding to establish a Technical Assistance for Historic and Environmental Assessments of the Dept. of Defense Properties for Easements to landlocked properties in Northern Guam. A condition is placed on this motion that the program be established only when funding is approved by the Guam Preservation Trust from the Dept. of Interior, Office of Insular Affairs.

Chairman Makio reported a motion was circulated to authorize the CPO to work with the named agencies to receive funding for technical assistance for historical and environmental assessments of Department Of Defense properties for easements to landlocked properties. The motion received the Board's majority approval.

#### Motion

With no further discussion, Helen Bordallo motioned to authorize the Chief Program Officer, Joe Quinata to work with the Guam Congressional Office, the Dept. of Interior, and the Office of Insular Affairs to receive funding for technical assistance for historical and environmental assessments of Dept. of Defense properties for easements to landlocked properties. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas.

The Chair opened the floor for any discussion.

John Mark Joseph noted DPR is currently working with Federal Highways on other landlocked properties in the northern area.

With no objections or further discussion, the motion unanimously carried.

#### 4.3. National History Day (NHD)

Joe Quinata reported annually NHD contacts all the state coordinators to meet to discuss updates on the National History program, congressional funding and the operations of each state's respective History Day organizations.

As the state coordinator, Joe Quinata was invited to attend. NHD will cover the airfare expenses however GPT will need to cover per diem expenses.

A meeting with the University of Guam is being scheduled to discuss their role to lead the Guam History Day Program.

#### Motion

With no further discussion, Helen Bordallo motioned to allow Joe Quinata to represent GPT in the National History Day meeting in Maryland; and to further approve a per diem allowance. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Stephenson. With no objections, the motion unanimously carried.

#### 4.4. Educational Series

Joe Quinata reported GPT is still involved with the efforts to save Pagat Village. To prepare for the draft SEIS in 2014 staff recommended to conduct an educational series to understand Section 106 which deals with the Historic Preservation Act.

Initially Brian Turner, from the National Trust was asked to present during the public screening of the "We are Pagat" film production which was selected to be shown during the Guam International Film Festival. By dovetailing on the event, Mr. Turner will conduct a "Military Buildup Brainstorming and Strategy Session" analyzing the buildup and programmatic agreement from an advocate's perspective.

The Board discussed the benefits from this session in its continued effort to Save Pagat Village.

#### Motion

With no further discussion, Marilyn Salas motioned to approve the education series, commissioning Brian Turner to present; and to further approve funds for his airfare and per diem with a not-to-exceed value of \$3000.00.

The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and with no objections, unanimously approved.

# 4.5. NTHP Conference (October 31-Nov 3, 2012; Spokane, Washington)/ APT Conference (Sept 30-Oct 4, 2012; Charleston, South Carolina)

Chairman Makio asked for members interested in attending to email their intent and the goals they wish to accomplish from these conferences.

#### 5.0 COMMITTEE REPORTS

#### 5.1. Budget & Finance Committee

Joe Quinata reported the current available fund is \$1,586,780.31. The total unobligated fund is \$490,699.89.

A payment request has been submitted to the Dept. of Administration to release the \$4.2 million for outstanding receivables due to GPT. The release is expected before the end of the week.

#### 5.2. Architecture Committee

Refer to Report

#### 5.2.a. Juan Flores House

Chairman Michael Makio reported the architecture committee met to discuss the application. The request was submitted to fund a series of repair work to rehabilitate the home. The amount has yet to be determined.

Joe Quinata reminded the Board of Doris Flores Lujan and the Manibusan homes still pending rehabilitation.

Staff recommended that Requests for Proposals (RFP) for all three homes be announced simultaneously. Solicitation for the RFP's is targeted for the end of the month.

#### Motion

With no further discussion Rebecca Duenas motioned to move the Juan Flores home for the queue line with the other home restoration projects, all subject to the availability of funds.

The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and with no objection unanimously approved.

#### 5.2.b. Palacio – Historic Structures Report

Chairman Michael Makio reported the committee was pleased with the Historic Structures Report submitted by Glen Mason as part of the amended contract with Duenas, Camacho & Associates.

Additional information was requested to produce the graphics, and site plan to show the proximity of the original Palacio outline relative to the Dept. of Administration and the nearby roads.

The Chair recommended that a formal presentation be made to Governor Eddie Calvo upon completion of the report and drawings.

Joe Quinata presented a photo narrative of the progress on the Taleyfak Bridge.

#### 5.3. Grants Committee

#### 5.3.a. Across the Water in Time Grant, Jilette Leon Guerrero

Committee Chair Marilyn Salas reported the committee requests additional time to review the grant application.

With no objections, the grant will be further reviewed and an option to circulate an email vote may be entertained for action.

#### 5.3.b. Archaeological Monitoring, Margaret Peredo

Joe Quinata reported the committee circulated an email motion to approve \$5000.00 the archaeological monitoring services for the Margaret Peredo property in Inarajan. The motion received the majority approval.

With no further discussion Rebecca Duenas ratified the motion to approve \$5000.00 for archaeological monitoring services for the Margaret Peredo property. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Stephenson and unanimously approved.

#### 5.3.c. Photographic History of the GPT – Edgar Flores

Joe Quinata reported grantee Edgar Flores submitted a letter that he is unable to fulfill the grant agreement and expressed his regrets to terminate the contract.

#### Motion

With no further discussion, Rebecca Duenas motioned to accept the request for termination. The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo.

With no objections, the motion unanimously carried.
