MINUTES

1.0 CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order at 1:06 p.m. by Chairman Makio and roll call was conducted.

2.0 SPECIAL ELECTION (Board Treasurer)

This item was tabled until the next Board meeting and after Legislative confirmation is received for members scheduled to renew terms.

3.0 APPROVAL OF MINUTES (5/15/14 Meeting)

Motion

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion on the minutes of May 15, 2014. With no comments or changes, Marilyn Salas motioned to approve the minutes as read. The motion was seconded by Richard Olmo and unanimously approved.

4.0 NEW BUSINESS

4.1 Micronesian Endowment for Historic Preservation (MEHP) and 2014 NPS Consultation Meeting – Request to Co-Sponsor meeting event.

Joe Quinata reported a letter requesting sponsorship for the 2014 Micronesian Endowment for Historic Preservation was received from Dept. of Parks & Recreation Director Ray Blas. The annual conference hosts the SHPO's from the Pacific region. The sponsorship request was to fund the reception dinner and t-shirts for participants, Director Blas obtained quotes and provided the lowest estimate of \$2875.00 for the reception and shirts. A copy of the agenda was provided for the Board's review. The Board discussed GPT's participation and support.

Motion

With no further discussion, Rebecca Duenas motioned to approve a not-to-exceed amount of \$3000.00 as sponsorship for the 2014 MEHP Conference & NPS Consulting Meeting. The motion was seconded by Richard Olmo and unanimously approved.

4.2 Asian Pacific Islanders Americans in Historic Preservation (APIA) Request to Co-Sponsor APIA Historic Preservation Forum.

Chairman Makio noted GPT is a founding member of APIA and has proven beneficial in receiving national attention and support beneficial to Guam immeasurable in dollars.

Legal representation in the efforts to *Save Pagat* was a result of GPT's participation with APIA.

Joe Quinata reported in alignment with President Obama's initiative, this year more youth participation will be encouraged to develop more interests in Historic Preservation. The 2014 APIA Forum will be held in Washington, D.C., at the Crystal City Hilton.

GPT was asked to co-sponsor the forum by hosting the evening reception.

The Board discussed GPT's previous APIA budget.

Chairman Makio requested for staff to prepare a tangible product for members to take with them showcasing GPT's accomplishments and upcoming projects.

Board members attending will be required to work during the event by networking and assisting in any logistical needs.

Motion

With no further discussion, Joaquin Perez motioned to approve \$15,000.00, to co-sponsor the 2014 APIA Forum. The motion was seconded by Richard Olmo and unanimously approved.

4.3 Revitalization Plan for the Village of Umatac – American Institute of Architects (AIA), Guam and Micronesia Chapter.

Joe Quinata reported a letter was received from AIA expressing interest in partnering with GPT for the Revitalization Plan for the village of Umatac.

Chairman Makio noted the AIA has mandates providing public service for interns and newly licensed architects to work with the community gaining experience in historic preservation. Joe Quinata assured the Board that the Umatac community will be involved with the development of the plan and be better informed of the federal mandates for historic properties.

Staff requested Board's approval to begin discussions on the revitalization plan for the village of Umatac.

Motion

With no further discussion, Richard Olmo motioned to allow Joe Quinata and staff to initiate the work for the revitalization plan with the understanding that any budget issues will be referred back to the Board for further direction. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

5.0 OLD BUSINESS

Joe Quinata reported the revised draft with the Board's recommendations was circulated via email for review.

Chairman Makio opened the floor for each member to present any comments.

The Chair extended appreciation to Dave Lotz and Joaquin Perez for their insight in finalizing the draft.



On behalf of the Forum Steering Committee of Asian Pacific Islander Americans in Historic Preservation (APIAHiP) we are writing to you to update you on the progress of plans for the third APIA National Historic Preservation Forum, to be held in Washington, D.C. in Fall 2014, and to invite the Guam Preservation Trust to sustain its prior, very meaningful financial commitment of \$15,000 to execution of the upcoming Forum. The Steering Committee recently reached the decision to hold the 2014 APIA National Historic Preservation Forum this coming fall, rather than in June as was previously under discussion. We will keep the Guam Preservation Trust posted as we finalize dates and venues for the 2014 Forum since we understand how critical calendaring is to planning.

As you know first-hand, in 2008, a group of Asian and Pacific Islander Americans (APIAs), nonprofit organizations, community activists, and professional and amateur preservationists forged a community-based group to foster awareness of and advocate for America's Asian Pacific Islander cultural and historic sites and to create a national network for APIA preservationists. Since then, Asian Pacific Islander Americans in Historic Preservation has mounted two APIA National Historic Preservation Forums (in San Francisco in 2010 and in Los Angeles in 2012), convening more than 300 people to exchange visions, strategies and challenges in stewardship, promotion, and preservation of historic places, personal narratives, cultural traditions and neighborhood resources significant to APIA communities. At both Forums, APIAHIP organized educational sessions, panel discussions, keynote addresses, group brainstorming, local tours to explore APIA neighborhoods and resources, and affinity group meetings. The enthusiastic response to each forum was demonstrated by growth in the number of registrants and their diversity; both Forums drew significant proportions of young people and the 2012 Forum drew attendees from the Midwest, South and Northeast, as well as the West. Youth outreach was a priority at both Forums, encouraged by a sliding scale and boosted by special scholarships offered by the National Park Service. These facts all point to the increasing

desire among API Americans for engagement in historic and cultural preservation and their hunger for improved public understanding and visibility for the historic sites associated with APIA chapters in U.S. history.

Although volunteer-organized and staffed, both the 2010 and 2012 Forums received critical support from the Guam Preservation Trust, along with support from other important partners:

The engaged participation of staff and board members from the Guam Preservation Trust has been a hallmark of the first two Forums and it is not an exaggeration to state that the evening hosted by the Guam Preservation Trust served as a culminating social occasion in both San Francisco and Los Angeles. The presence of a Guam contingent has measurably enlivened and enriched past Forums, and we believe that the Guam Preservation Trust's collaboration as a founding partner has helped shape Forum content, influenced outcomes, and offered a compelling example of the Forums' reach and potential reach.

Our all-volunteer Steering Committee provides leadership for our biennial forums, advocacy around a national APIA preservation agenda, and oversight as we develop new projects. Our fiscal sponsor is National Coalition for Asian Pacific American Community Development (National CAPACD). We maintain an active list-serve, are currently redesigning our website, and participate in national gatherings related to historic and cultural preservation.

We are currently planning our third Forum for Fall 2014, to be held in Washington, D.C. The National Trust for Historic Preservation, National CAPACD, the National Park Service and the Smithsonian Asian Pacific American Program are supporting us in our efforts. We envision APIAHiP Forum 2014 as an opportunity to deepen connections with more APIA communities beyond the West Coast and to engage substantively in policy and advocacy related to APIA

heritage and preservation. We aim to provide a full day of workshops, panels, educational sessions, and keynote speakers, along with a second day dedicated to meeting with elected officials at the US Capitol and tours of local community resources. The National Park Service recently announced the launch of a national Theme Study on APIA history and this is an important moment to strengthen connections at the federal level on the topic of APIA historic and cultural preservation and improved understanding and visibility for historic sites associated with APIA history in America.

It is our sincere hope that at APIAHiP Forum 2014, once again, we will be able to offer a rich experience of community dialogue to returning registrants, as well as to fresh audiences. On the stage of the nation's capital, we intend to foster community-building through the exchange of visions, strategies and challenges in stewardship, promotion, and preservation of APIA historic places and cultural resources; to share cultural traditions, personal narratives, and neighborhood resources significant to APIA communities. The members of the APIAHiP Steering Committee invite the Guam Preservation Trust to seriously consider continuing its past transformative support for the APIAHiP Forum by providing \$15,000 to sponsor a Guam Evening. We would love to think that in the Fall of 2014 we will be able to introduce a new crop of community preservationists to the music, flavors, and hospitality of Guahan at an evening event hosted by the Guam Preservation Trust; similarly and most importantly, we look forward to seeing the faces of our friends and colleagues from the Guam Preservation Trust around the panel tables, in the corridors, and leavening the proceedings at APIAHiP Forum 2014 in Washington, D.C.
