1.0. CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Michael Makio at 3:20 p.m. and roll call was conducted.

2.0. APPROVAL OF MINUTES (December 6, 2017)

Motion

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion on the minutes of December 6, 2017. With no changes or discussion, Rebecca Duenas motioned to approve the minutes as read. The motion was seconded by Dave Lotz and unanimously approved.

3.0 ELECTION OF OFFICERS

3.1. Vice-Chair; 3.2. Secretary; 3.3. Treasurer

Chairman Makio reported the Historic Review Board conducted its election of Officers during the last meeting and voted the Chair to maintain his position.

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion and asked if the current slate of GPT officers were willing to accept and maintain their positions. Pale Eric Forbes accepted the position as Board Secretary.

Motion

With no objections, all members present were in favor of approving the slate of officers as follows: Dave Lotz as Vice Chair, Rebecca Duenas as Treasurer and Pale Eric Forbes as Secretary. The action unanimously carried.

4.0 EXECUTIVE SESSION

Chairman Makio recessed the General Board meeting and entered into Executive Session.

Chairman Makio adjourned Executive Session and reconvened the General Board meeting at 4:00 p.m.

5.0 OLD BUSINESS

5.1. Pacific Preservation Project – Summit

Joe Quinata reported an update on the upcoming Summit to be held on February 26-28, 2018. Keynote Speakers have been confirmed and village Mayors will also be participating. To date 220 participants have registered.

A draft program booklet was circulated for Board's review.

The Summit is being funded by a Dept. of Interior grant, but as a safeguard to avoid any interruptions in the program, the staff requested the Board to approve a not-to-exceed amount of \$10,000.00 for any unexpected expenses that may occur.

Motion

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to approve a not-to-exceed amount of \$10,000.00 to support the Pacific Preservation Summit.

The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

5.2. Secondary High School & Post-Secondary Curriculum Preservation Education

Joe Quinata reported a meeting was held with Okkado High School to discuss implementing a preservation program as part of their engineering class.

A sample lesson plan was provided to the instructor.

Chairman Makio requested a meeting with the instructor to discuss the curriculum.

Joe Quinata reported Bill Jeffery is offering a Heritage Preservation course at the University of Guam on Saturday afternoon from 12:30-1:50 p.m. Chairman Makio requested a copy of the content of the course.

5.3. Property Donation - Cliff Condominium Unit

Chairman Makio reported the property is currently rented to a tenant. Legal Counsel reported the results of the PTR received on the property. The Board discussed the different options for the unit's use. Discussion was tabled for further review.

5.4. Archbishop Felixberto Flores House

Chairman Makio reported he was informed the property is being listed for sale. It was previously reported the property was being transferred to Kamalen Karidat. Joe Quinata inquired on the property and was informed the property is in the process of being de-listed from liquidation sale.

The Board discussed the interest of the Trust in acquiring the property for its historic vernacular architecture.

Motion

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to direct the Chief Program Officer to correspond with the Archdiocese to express ownership interest in acquiring the Archbishop Flores House. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

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5.5. NTHP Conference (Nov. 13-15, 2018);

5.6. APIAHip Forum (Nov. 11-13, 2018)

Joe Quinata announced the NTHP Conference and APIA Forum will be held back to back in San Francisco in November.

The Board was encouraged to submit an abstract for presentations at the conference and the forum.

Chairman Makio suggested abstracts on Litekyan and the military buildup.

Staff will provide the Board with proposed topics for presentation.

GPT was asked to host for a Guam Night as the closing of the APIAHip Forum.

5.7. Reconstruction of the Palacio, Plaza De España

Joe Quinata reported GEDA has not responded to his request for an update on the Palacio, the Memorandum of Agreement, and approval by the Legislative and Executive branches.

The Board discussed the recommendation to include the language as recommended during the December 6, 2017 meeting before a final MOA is issued.

Motion

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to correspond with GEDA to include the language in the memorandum of agreement as follows: "GEDA agrees to provide funding under the Hot Bond Program for design and reconstruction of the Palacio building according to the Secretary of Interior Standards."

The motion was seconded by Pale Eric Forbes and unanimously approved.

6.0 NEW BUSINESS

Program Officer Position

With no objections with the Board, Chairman Makio added this item for discussion under New Business.

A Program Officer position was advertised and interviews were conducted by Board members and the Chief Program Officer.

The Board discussed the probationary period and benefits offered by GPT. As a result of the interviews and in consideration of the need for staff, it was recommended to hire two (2) program officers from the applicants interviewed.

Motion

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to increase the hiring of two (2), program officers. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

Motion

A motion was made by Rebecca Duenas to direct the Chief Program Officer to move ahead in hiring the top two (2) responders. The motion was seconded by Dave Lotz and unanimously approved.

Motion

An amended motion was made to also increase the (Administrative) Budget to reflect an identical salary for the additional Program Officer position.

The amended motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

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IDIQ (indefinite delivery/indefinite quantity) Contract

Chairman Makio reported the Board has discussed augmenting professional services relative to in depth technical review and consultation (i.e., Section 106, Programmatic Agreement, federal issues)..

Currently there is no level of the expertise to review federal issues that impact GPT.

Chairman Makio recommended for the CPO to work with legal counsel to draft the scope of work for an IDIQ program. Fee schedules and hourly rates can be further reviewed after the scope is reviewed.

The individual or organization must be knowledgeable on the National Preservation Act, Section 106, and current military affairs.

Nicole Santos inquired on the contracted service as a resource to assist the SHPO's office.

Chairman Makio responded there will definitely be collaboration between the two. Dave Lotz commented the position would really not provide assistance to the Historic Resources Division but provide in depth analysis and recommendation to what the GPT Board feels should be done relative to the Programmatic Agreement and other federal issues.

The Historic Resources Division has technical assistance provided and the Attorney General's office serves as their legal counsel.

Motion

With no further discussion, Pale Eric motioned to instruct the Chief Program Officer to work with legal counsel to create a Request for Qualifications and scope of work for consultation services relative to programmatic agreement, Section 106 and other related preservation interactions. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

An official letter was submitted to the Governor and Mayor of CNMI and Rota. And staff has developed the website to promote the Summit.

7.1. Budget & Finance Report

7.1.a. YTD Balance

Joe Quinata reported the current fund balance is \$2,287,229.46. The total obligated fund is \$2,081,957.68. A total of \$205,271.78 is the restricted balance for grants and projects.

The Board asked to request TD Ameritrade to close Investment account balance of 23 cents.

Chairman Makio reported only one firm submitted a proposal for both projects. A proposal of \$96,488.47 was received from the firm Provido, Tan, Jones Architects for the A&E of the Rosario House.

A proposal of \$83,217.21 was received from the firm Provido, Tan, Jones Architects for the A&E of the Benny San Nicolas House.

The committee reviewed the proposals and recommended approval for both homes.

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Motion

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to approve the fee proposals (\$96,488.47 for the A&E for the Rosario House; \$83,217.21 for the A&E for the Benny San Nicolas House).

The motion was seconded by Pale Eric Forbes and unanimously approved.

7.2.c. Doris Flores House – Change Order

Chairman Makio reported a no-cost change order was submitted by the contractor to extend the contract term by 31 days.

GPT Staff has consulted with the construction manager to validate the request. The committee recommended approval of the Change Order.

Motion

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to approve to extend the contract by 31 days. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and was unanimously approved.

7.3. Grants Committee Report



The following fee Proposal is based upon the general scope of rehabilitation work as outlined in the GPT Request for Proposal General Scope of Work for the following homes:

- 1) Benny San Nicolas House, Lot 38, Inarajan, Guam
- 2) Rosario House, Lots 55 & 62 within Lot 27, Block 25 Hagatna, Guam

SECTION 1: SCOPE OF SERVICES

1.1 BASIS OF DESIGN (30% SUBMITTAL):

- A. Review and compile Owner Supplied Data, conduct historic research and develop recommendations and guidelines for rehabilitation work.
- B. Conduct limited soils investigation and percolation tests as required for the three lots.
- C. Conduct topography survey of the lots and indicate existing easements, utilities, ROW, including building spot elevations of existing sloped roofs as required.
- D. Prepare architectural and engineering record drawings based on visual and non-invasive field review of existing site conditions.
- E. Based on Items 1A.thru 1C. above, preparation of Preliminary Conceptual Drawings, Outline Specifications, Cost Estimates and Design Calculations
- F. Develop landscaping plan for Lot 39. Prepare fee proposal for approved scope of work.
- G. Coordinate with local and federal agencies applicable codes and regulations.
- H. Prepare meeting minutes of progress plan review meeting with GPT.
- I. Provide (1) original and (2) copies deliverables

1.2 DESIGN DRAWINGS (60% SUBMITTAL):

A. Based on approved Section 1.1 above and GPT progress review comments, prepare Architectural and Engineering Historic Rehabilitation Construction Drawings, Specifications, Cost Estimates and Design Calculations.
