**1.0. CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL**

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Michael Makio at 3:15 p.m., and roll call was conducted. Chairman Makio recognized the four interns in attendance. Joe Quinata introduced the interns and the projects they will be assigned to complete.

**2.0. APPROVAL OF MINUTES (April 10, 2017)**

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion on the minutes of April 10, 2017.

**Motion** With no discussion or changes, Rebecca Duenas motioned to approve the minutes as read. The motion was seconded by Dave Lotz and unanimously approved.

**3.0 EXECUTIVE SESSION**

No discussion.

**4.0 OLD BUSINESS**

**4.1. Moratorium – Grants**

Grants Committee Chair James Viernes reported the committee met to discuss the current moratorium on grants.

The committee's recommendations were to 1) allocate a \$100,000.00 budget for grants for the next fiscal year; 2) create different categories of grants (micro – below \$500; mini - below \$5,000.00; and project grants – above \$5,000.00); 3) Grants must address one (1) or all areas of the five Year Strategic Plan; and 4) Hold periodic workshops requiring all applicants to attend to ensure guidance, compliance, and increase awareness.

The Board discussed inclusion with the FY18 Budget.

The committee further recommended conducting the grant workshops in October and June in order to meet the January and August Grant cycle deadlines.

The Board discussed allocation for grants will be separate from funding Board initiatives.

The Board discussed the Chief Program Officer's discretionary authority verses the micro-grant category and process.

**Motion**

With no further discussion, James Viernes motioned to allocate \$100,000.00 in the next fiscal year for grants plus \$1,000.00 for workshop costs to review grants for possible micro (below \$500.00), mini (below \$5,000.00) or project funding (above \$5,000.00); requiring that successful applications meet one (1) or more of the elements of the 5 year strategic plan; and that we hold two workshops per year requiring all grant applicants to attend one of the workshops to have their grants advance; and that this funding be separate from funding for board initiatives and not to coincide with discretionary funds.

The motion was seconded by Cacilie Craft and unanimously approved.

No change was made on the existing moratorium for the current fiscal year.

**4.2. Research Design Archaeological Studies at Humatak sites of San Dionisio Areopagita Church (Ruins) and Palacio**

Joe Quinata reported an update of the study and excavation work completed thus far. GPT's interns and the youth from the Humatak Community Foundation have been working alongside the archaeologists at the site.

A pictorial summary was distributed for review.

**4.3. National Historic Landmark Nomination**

Cacilie Craft reported the ad hoc committee reviewed the goals in putting forth nominations and discussed whether nomination would be better suited if submitted by another entity.

The committee reviewed discontinuous sites, and the Guam Congress Building as a viable candidate for nomination.

**Action**

Joe Quinata will circulate the notes taken by Andrew Tenorio from the ad hoc committee meeting for further discussion at the next Board meeting.

**4.4. Secondary High School Curriculum & Post-Secondary Curriculum Preservation Program**

Joe Quinata reported the curriculum will need to be introduced as a pilot program if introduced as a course.

Chairman Makio recommended formulating the context of the program synthesized to apply to Guam to introduce to the teachers.

**Action**

Joe Quinata will re-circulate the draft curriculum for Board's review.

**5.0 NEW BUSINESS**

**5.1. Humatak Village Revitalization Plan**

Joe Quinata reported a proposal was received from AIA for the Humatak Revitalization Plan.

The Plan will be formulated by the community's input, and with the respective government agencies mirroring the procedures implemented with the Inarajan Revitalization Plan.

Thereafter, recommendations will be presented to the community of Humatak.

AIA will match GPT's support and provide an in-kind contribution of \$12,000.00 in scholarships.

**Motion**

With no further discussion, a motion was made by Cacilie Craft to approve the proposal with AIA for \$50,000.00 for the Humatak Revitalization Plan. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

**5.2. 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Marianas History Conference – Northern Marianas Council on Humanities**

Joe Quinata reported GPT has supported the Marianas History Conference since its inception. The Board discussed GPT's past contributions and reviewed the 2017 sponsorship packages. The conference will be held in Saipan from September 1-3, 2017. Board members interested in attending were asked to submit their request to Chairman Makio.

**Motion**

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to approve Gold Sponsorship (\$3,000.00) for the 2017 Marianas History Conference. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and approved by the majority. James Viernes recused himself from voting.

**5.3. Dancing Earth Tour – Humanities Guahan**

Joe Quinata circulated the solicitation letter. The Board discussed the relevance to GPT's mission. This discussion was tabled.

**5.4 Board Travel – Association for Preservation Technology Conference (10/11-14/17); National Trust for Historic Preservation Conference (Nov 14 – 17, 2017)**

Chairman Makio reported the APT conference will be held in Canada which focuses in preservation technology.

The National Trust Conference will be held in Chicago.

Board members interested in attending the conferences were asked to email Chairman Makio with a brief explanation of how their participation will benefit the Trust.

The Board was encouraged to go on-line to visit the conference agendas.

**5.5. FY18 Administration/Operations Budget**

Joe Quinata recommended a Budget & Finance Committee be held to review the proposed FY18 Administration/Operations Budget.

The Budget will be presented at the next Board meeting for the Board's review and/or approval. Chairman Makio requested Joe Quinata poll Board members for a convenient time to schedule the committee meeting.

**Action****5.6. Archbishop Flores House – Appraisal**

Chairman Makio reported the Archbishop Flores House is one of the last examples of vernacular architecture in the historic district of Hagatna, and may be on the market for sale by the Archdiocese of Agana.

Prospective buyers may not recognize or appreciate the historical value of the property.

**Action**

Joe Quinata was asked to obtain quotes to conduct an appraisal of the property.

Legal Counsel also noted a Broker's Price Opinion can be obtained to get an estimate of appraised value in an expedited manner.

**Motion**

With no further discussion Cacilie Craft motioned to approve a not-to-exceed amount of \$5,000.00 for procuring an appraisal of the Archbishop Flores House.

The motion was seconded by James Viernes and unanimously approved.

**5.7. 2018 Pacific Heritage Youth Summit**

Joe Quinata reported the National Park Service (NPS) has informed GPT they will support and fund \$30,800.00 for the 2018 Pacific Heritage Youth Summit which will be held in Rota in July.

Joe Quinata requested the Board's approval of \$20,000.00 to assist in funding the Summit.

The amount of \$9,698.00 will be received from other funding sources.

The Board discussed the shortfall from previous year's support from NPS.

**Motion**

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to approve \$20,000.00, for the 2018 Pacific Heritage Youth Summit. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas.

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion.

Chairman Makio recommended holding off approval amidst all the other projects in queue and the convening of the Budget & Finance Committee meeting to review the FY18 Budget.

Dave Lotz suggested approving the funding in the same manner as the 2018 Grants budget was approved in earlier agenda Item 4.1.

**Amended Motion**

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz withdrew his earlier motion and amended the motion to direct the Budget & Finance committee to include \$20,000.00 in the 2018 Budget for the Pacific Heritage Youth Summit. With no objections, the motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

Hafa Adai Mr. Quinata,

The AIA Guam & Micronesia chapter is pleased to provide you with a scope and fee proposal for the Humatak Village Revitalization Plan. The primary objective of the Revitalization Plan is to document professional and community input in order to outline the development of Humatak Village over a period of 15-20 years.

The basis for the Revitalization Plan will include:

- Development Goals of the Humatak Residents, Mayor, and the Humatak Community Foundation as identified through Focus Group Meetings facilitated by the Guam Preservation Trust.
- DPW Highway & Storm Water Master Plans
- GVB Guam Tourism 2020 Plan
- Guam Housing Plan
- GPA Utilities Master Plan
- GTA Master Plan
- Telecom Master Plans
- Tour Bus Routes & Public Transit
- Regulation and Maps by State Historic Preservation Office
- Zoning and Seashore Regulations and pertinent GLUC project approvals
- GEPA regulations

Information will be gathered from these various resources to develop a holistic planning tool that outlines the revitalization for Humatak village. Emphasis will be placed on Humatak's importance as one of the most picturesque locations on Guam and its potential as a key element in enhancing Guam's tourism industry. The Revitalization Plan will explore opportunities presented by other Agency Master Plans, integrating them into developments that address stakeholder needs and highlight the village's physical features & history. Architectural Schematic Design work will also be executed for key projects.

**Project Milestones & Deliverables:**

The anticipated timeframe for the project is 12 months with the following milestones:

- 30% submittal, 4 months from NTP  
Preliminary Report, Questionnaire & Interview Notes , Background Drawings, Planning Research, and Preliminary Schematic Designs.
- 60% submittal, 2 months from receipt of 30% comments  
Draft Revitalization Plan, Developed Schematic Designs.
- 90% submittal, 2 months from receipt of 60% comments  
Pre-Final Revitalization Plan, Refined Schematic Designs.
- 100% submittal, 1 month from receipt of 90% comments  
Final Document;

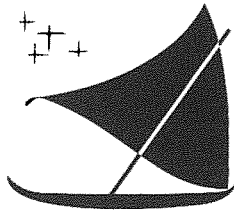
**Fee:**

The project will be executed with some pro bono time and material costs for rendered professional services. The project will require services from a team of architects and associates over the project timeframe noted above. This is estimated to require 800 man-hours minimum, which would equate to a fee of \$100,000 approximately. AIA Guam & Micronesia's fee for the project will be limited to \$50,000 acknowledging that pro bono time & material costs will be provided as community service. Furthermore, AIA Guam & Micronesia intends to contribute at least \$12,000 of this fee towards our College Scholarship Program.

Please contact me to confirm that this fee proposal is in accordance with Guam Preservation Trust's requirements. AIA Guam & Micronesia looks forward to commencing this endeavor in June 2017.

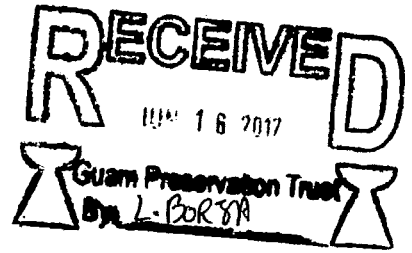
