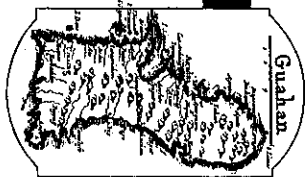

1.0 CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL
The meeting was called to order by Chairman Michael Makio at 3:50 p.m. and conducted roll call.

2.0 APPROVAL OF MINUTES (11/13/13 Meeting)
Chairman Makio opened the floor for review of the minutes of the November 13, 2013, Board meeting.
With no changes or comments, a motion was made by Rebecca Duenas to approve the minutes as read. The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and unanimously approved.

3.0 OLD BUSINESS

3.1. Youth Summit - U.S. Dept. of Interior Partnership, July 2014
Joe Quinata reported Hank Florence from the National Park Service was on island to attend the first planning session held on December 12th.
Nicole Calvo reported approximately 16 individuals from 13 different organizations, institutions, and agencies connected to preservation and conservation responded to our call and present at the meeting. The Youth Summit mission is to teach, inspire and prepare students in the realm of preservation, conservation, and heritage tourism, of our national and cultural resources. The next meeting will be held on January 9, 2014.
Joe Quinata reported of an estimated \$54,000 needed to conduct the summit of which National Park Service will fund \$25,000.00. A total of 125 Youth Participants is expected which will include attendees from the surrounding Pacific islands.

3.2. "Sumay: Rikuetdo Para I Famagu'on-ta (A Legacy for Our Children)
A Community History Publication – R. Arlene Santos
Joe Quinata reported a copy of the Sumay Publication was provided to each Board member with the exhibit panels displayed for the Board to view.

A total of 300 copies were provided to the Trust for circulation to the families, libraries, and other reference resources throughout the island.

4.0 NEW BUSINESS

4.1. Chamorro Hands in Education Links Unity (CHE'LU);

San Diego Sakman Chamorro Project – Danny Blas

Joe Quinata reported Mr. Danny Blas, Chair for CHE'LU San Diego based organization has submitted a request for sponsorship to fund safety equipment to train the crew of the Sakman Chamorro Project to sail beyond the Bay Area. Their total request is for \$5000.00. The organization built a 47 foot replica of the Chamorro flying proa using the George Anson drawings of 1742.

Motion

With no further discussion a motion was made by Rebecca Duenas to approve the sponsorship request of \$5000.00 for the Chamorro Hands in Education Links Unity, San Diego Sakman Chamorro Project. The motion was seconded by Richard Olmo and unanimously approved.

4.2. Guam History Day Sponsorship – MARC, University of Guam

Joe Quinata reported MARC Interim Director Monique Storie submitted a request for sponsorship for the 2014 Guam/National History competition. The goal is to raise \$60,000.00 for the program and have requested GPT's sponsorship of \$30,000 and will aggressively look at other funding sources to augment the balance.

The Board discussed the program and felt the funding participation was manageable.

Motion

With no further discussion, Helen Bortallo motioned to fund \$30,000.00 for the Guam History Day Activities for 2014. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

5.0 COMMITTEE REPORTS

5.1. BUDGET & FINANCE COMMITTEE

5.1.a. YTD Balance

Joe Quinata reported current is \$6,295,542.98 with a total fund available for grants and projects \$5.2 million.

Projects in cue will cost approximately 4.2 million for the Legislature, the construction of the three homes in Inalahan, and the FQ Sanchez Facility.

Joe Quinata presented a brief update progress on the Guam Legislature project.

The Board reviewed the Administration and Operations Expenditure Summary.

5.2. ARCHITECTURE COMMITTEE

Chairman Makio reported the committee met to review the submissions for the three sites and reached a clear ranking for each of the site nominations.

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No formal announcement will be made until negotiations are completed, and the proposals satisfy the scope of work and within the budget.

**5.3. GRANTS COMMITTEE

No grants were submitted for the January cycle.

Taleyfak Bridge

Joe Quinata reported GPT has paid a total of \$191.00 for a seven month consumption of power at the site.

The Board initially approved limited funding for power consumption in consideration of the new facility and supporting several events during the Taleyfak turn over.

The Board directed staff to contact DPR to take over the utility obligations and be reminded of the Trust's mandates not to be used for Government operations.

Meno House

Chairman Makio expressed his concerns on the progress of the Meno House in Inlalahan and recommended to write-off the project and start a new under the direction of the Trust to solicit bidders, obtaining the permitting for construction. Professionals are needed to complete the project.

The materials purchased under the initial grant were stored and have since rotted.

Chairman Makio recommended terminating any of the activities related to the original grant and then to begin the HSR and the beginning of the documentation to move the Meno house into HSR work. Further suggestion was to salvage as much of the materials purchased for use on the House.

It was the SHPO's opinion that the Meno House should have been approached as a restoration instead of reconstruction project.

Motion

With no further discussion, Richard Olmo motioned to terminate the Meno House project undertaken with Gef Pago and Historic Inlalahan Foundation. The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and unanimously approved.

Staff was directed to work with Meno House families to discuss opportunities to move ahead.

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EXECUTIVE SESSION

Chairman Makio requested to enter into Executive Session.
With no objection, the Board entered into Executive Session.

6.0 OPEN DISCUSSION

-Antantano Property

Chairman Makio reported an update of a sizeable property donation as previously reported at the November Board meeting.

A draft agreement has been prepared and reviewed by the GPT Legal Counsel.

The property contains numerous archaeological finds, wetlands, conservation sites, and medicinal plants.

A motion is needed to allow GPT to sign the donation agreement with the condition that it not be finalized until the Phase I Environmental Exhibits are provided showing no contamination.

The entire Environmental Assessment program was approved by the Board and awarded to ARC Environmental Services and will be completed by December 24, 2013.

Legal counsel will provide additional legal services to ensure the environment opportunities are in good order.

Motion

With no further discussion Rebecca Duenas motioned to sign the donation agreement with the condition that it is not finalized until the Phase I Environmental Exhibit is provided showing no contamination.

The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and unanimously approved.

Hata Adai, Mr. Quinata:

I writing to you today seeking support for our San Diego-based Sakman Chamorro Project.

CHELU, Chamorro Hands in Education Links Unity, is a non-profit organization based in San Diego, dedicated to the preservation of Chamorro culture, language, and health through education. I serve as Chair of the Board of Directors.

The Sakman Chamorro Project is our flagship community project, which began with the building of a 47-foot replica of the Chamorro flying proa, faithfully constructed using the George Anson drawings of 1742. The canoe has become a cultural touchstone, uniting all Chamorros, and reigniting the pride in our Chamorro sea-faring legacy (an image of the canoe is included for your review).

As we begin to focus our efforts on sailing this outrigger, we find that we need funding support to continue our project. We are asking for your help. We are seeking your kind consideration and generosity in the amount of \$5,000. Here is the breakdown of the request Mario discussed with you that would meet our immediate needs to support the training program:

Sail: 470 square feet rip-stop Dacron	\$5K	
Outboard motor: 10 HP extended shaft	\$5K	
All-weather gear: 10 crew members	\$5K	
	\$15K	TOTAL

The Sakman crew has been training in the San Diego Bay since 2011, but have yet to venture into open ocean due to the lack of the critical safety equipment listed above. Our ultimate goal is to sail the vessel to the Islas Marianas in January 2016. The critical safety equipment will help us continue our training with added safety for the crew.

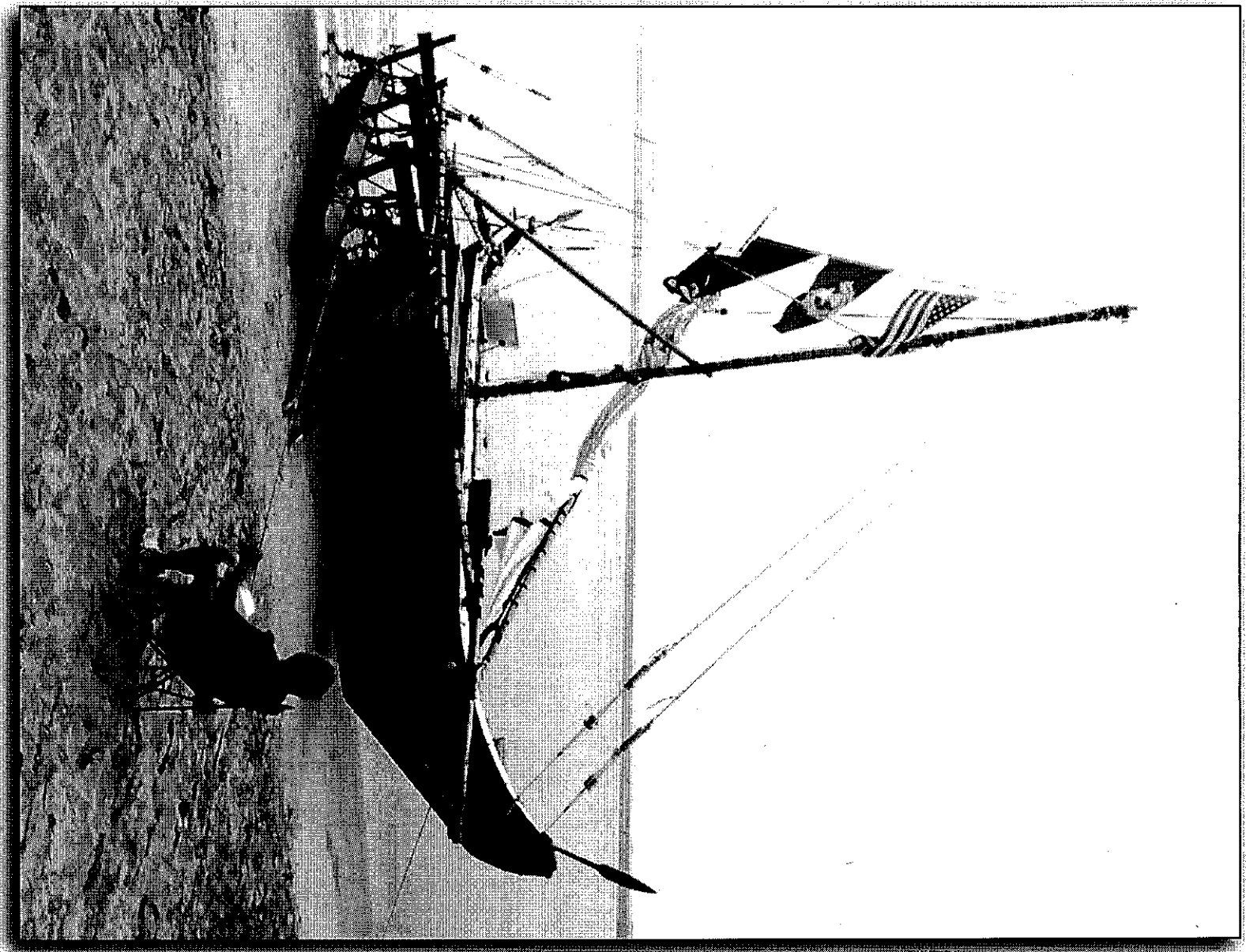

This school year, over 600 Guam students from the private, public, and defense schools researched, wrote, and presented Guam's history in various formats such as documentary, website, exhibit, performance, and paper. These projects were made possible through the Guam History Day program, an initiative of the Guam Preservation Trust and now a program administered by the Richard Flores Taitano - Micronesian Area Research Center (MARC) at the University of Guam. How students learn Guam's History is beginning to shift from the textbook-based curriculum to the methodology of research-based, writing, and presentation. We believe that as we continue with this trend, our children will learn the skills necessary to succeed in life and most importantly know their history and who they are.

Funding the Guam History Day program is a shared responsibility and we are exploring ways to allow the community to take ownership by assisting us to sustain a great program for our children. Our goal is to raise \$60,000.00 to sustain this program. For the past six years, the Guam Preservation Trust has been subsidizing most of the program costs for the island-wide and national competitions. This year we are aggressively seeking funding from the community to help subsidize the travel portion of the program to allow all eligible students to compete at the local and national competitions. Student and teachers are already asked to pay for certain program requirements (registration fees, per diem, travel insurance, uniforms, and other incidentals). All of the program monies received will go towards the program competitions both locally and nationally.

We ask your continued help by sponsoring \$30,000.00 to sustain the program and allow our Guam students the opportunity to compete at the local and national history day competition this school year (2014).
