1.0 CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Michael Makio and roll call was conducted.

2.0 APPROVAL OF MINUTES (1/8/14 Meeting)

Motion

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion on the minutes of January 8, 2014. With no changes or discussion, Rebecca Duenas motioned to approve the minutes as read. The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and unanimously approved.

3.0 EXECUTIVE SESSION

Chairman Makio recessed the General Board meeting and called an Executive Session. With no objections, the Board recessed and entered into Executive Session.

The Board adjourned Executive Session and reconvened the General Board meeting.

4.0 NEW BUSINESS

4.1. Discovery Day Celebration Sponsorship, Humåtak Foundation

The Board reviewed a letter of solicitation from the Humatak Foundation requesting to sponsor the 2014 Discovery Day Celebration scheduled for two consecutive weekends, from February 28-March 2, & March $7-9^{th}$.

Highlights of this year's celebration will include the usual festivity events, Magellan reenactment, with concentration on the Humatak Historic Walking Tour where trained youth will serve as docents at each of the historic sites.

The Board discussed the accountability and use of the funds.

Motion

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to approve \$15,000.00 as requested for the Discovery Day Celebration, provided the Humatak Foundation provided an expenditure report is submitted.

The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and unanimously approved.

Joe Quinata noted Discovery Day T-Shirts will be provided for the Board members.

4.2. "I Am Chamorro" documentary - Manhita Chamorro

Joe Quinata reported the non-profit organization "Manhita Chamorro" has requested sponsorship of \$15,000 to support a video production entitled "We together, Chamorro," covering the period pre-European contact.

The Board discussed requesting a breakdown of the sponsorship.

A condition may be placed on the sponsorship that funds will be applied to research and production and not for duplication of videos. The completion target date is 2016.

The organization is based in Redondo Beach.

Pale Eric Forbes will be narrating the documentary.

The Board requested that further information be requested from the organization (i.e., copy of 5013C certificate, expenditure report, completion dateline, etc.).

The Board requested a presentation from Pale Eric Forbes to provide more information on the project.

Action

Staff will contact Pale Eric and coordinate and advise the Board.

4.3. Antantano Appreciation Reception

Chairman Makio reported the final filing of the property title and transfer is ongoing and near completion. The plan for the programs and proposed use of the property is being drafted and a brief video of the site will be presented at the reception.

The programs will be focused on a Heritage Preserve, Conservation Preserve, Archaeological Research and Sustainable Enterprise.

Staff requested funding for the reception and to prepare the exhibit for display. A tentative date is scheduled for early March 2014.

Chairman Makio reported AIA is willing to partner with the Trust to prepare the graphics and imagery for the property.

At the request of the Board, staff will arrange a tour of the property site.

Motion

With no further discussion, Rebecca Duenas motioned to authorize \$20,000.00 to fund the Atantano exhibit and reception. The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and unanimously approved.

4.4. Legal Service Agreement

Joe Quinata reported an amendment extending the terms of the legal service agreement has been submitted Attorney Brooks with no change to the hourly rates. The rates will be provided to the Board for reference.

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Motion

With no further discussion, Rebecca Duenas motioned to renew the legal service agreement with Attorney Terrence Brooks. The motion was seconded by Dave Lotz and unanimously approved.

5.0 OLD BUSINESS

5.1. Strategic Plan 2013-17

Joe Quinata updated the Board of the Strategic Plan.

The staff requested the Board's approval for formalize the plan for print.

The Board requested the plan to include total costs for each of the programs areas, and to include a carryover program for archaeological plans for vernacular housing.

The Board discussed how the Strategic Plan will be implemented through partnerships and grant programs.

Motion

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to approve the Strategic Plan. The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas and unanimously approved.

5.2. Plaza De España – Letter of Proposal

Joe Quinata reported a copy of the proposal was circulated to the Board.

The following changes were recommended:

3rd sentence, change to read, "....Spanish built a complex for the Spanish Governor."

4th sentence, change to read, "...Magalahes, official residence and office of the island's administrating authority."

5th sentence is incomplete, change to read, "In 1885, Governor Don Enrique Solano...."

Staff will work on the language and forward to the Board.

Motion

With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to approve the Plan in concept subject editorial adjustments to be presented to the CPO within the next week. The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and unanimously approved.

5.3. Pacific Heritage Youth Summit

Joe Quinata reported the update on the Summit.

The selection of the Middle and High school student participants will be coordinated by the respective SHPO offices in the Pacific region.

Funding is essentially equal among the coordinating partners.

The Board reviewed the Budget.

Reservations are needed to be secured to secure the accommodations for participants.

The Board guestioned the emphasis of the aquatic resources.

Joe Quinata noted the activities will infuse Historic preservation in the existing programs.

Motion

With no further discussion, Rebecca Duenas motioned to approve the funding of \$20,000.00 for the sponsorship of the Pacific Heritage Youth Summit.

The motion was seconded by Helen Bordallo and unanimously approved.

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Board members were invited to observe the activities.

5.4. Chagui'an Massacre Site Nomination - Fee Proposal

Joe Quinata reported the Architecture committee selected Garcia and Associates to prepare the nomination.

A fee proposal was submitted for \$18,558.00 to produce the scope of work for the nomination.

Motion

With no further discussion, Helen Bordallo motioned to approve the Garcia & Associates fee proposal of \$18,558.00 for the Chagui'an Massacre Site Nomination. The motion was seconded by Dave Lotz and unanimously approved.

Joe reported DOA will be releasing \$600,000.00 to the Trust for the permit fees collected from the previous quarter.

Guam Legislature

Joe Quinata reported the passage of recent Legislation cleared concerns raised by the Attorney General's office on the loan conditions with the Bank of Guam. Upon final confirmation from the Legislature, GPT will initiate the construction administration and proceed to solicit bids for construction.

6.1.b. FY13 Audit

Joe Quinata reported the Trust was issued a clean audit for FY13.

The Board requested for Ernst & Young (EY) to meet for a formal presentation of the FY13 Audit.

Staff will contact EY to coordinate a date for the presentation and advise.

6.2.a. Four Homes in Inalahan – Addendum; Provido, Tan, Jones Architects Inc.

Dear Mr. Makio.

First, I would like to thank your staff for meeting with Pale' Eric Forbes and I regarding this wonderful opportunity to be considered as a sponsor partner. Plaza de España Management Plan

Historical Background

Prior to the advent of Spanish contact in 1521 and later establishment of Guam as a Spanish colony, the village of Hagåtña was a settlement of Chamorros. Upon the inception of Spanish settlement and occupation, the Spanish constructed a complex for the Spanish Governor called the Plaza de España in 1736. The complex was originally named the Plaza de Magalahes as it was the official residence and seat of administration for the island's administering authority. In 1885, Governor Don Enrique Solano with a larger building. The buildings in the Plaza de España was constructed in the traditional Spanish style of either wood or manposteria. After the Spanish-American War in 1898, and the onset of the American Naval administration, the Plaza remained the seat of administration and official residence for the new American Naval Governors. The Governor's palace was renovated after it was damaged in an earthquake in 1905. Under the Japanese Occupation of Guam during World War II, the Governor's palace at the Plaza de España became the headquarters for Japanese forces.

The structures of the Plaza de España, including the Governor's Palace were destroyed during the American invasion of Guam from Japanese forces in July 1944. The remaining structures such as the walls of the Plaza, garden house, azotea, and the Chocolate House have undergone several restorations with the most recent repair completed in 2013.

As the Plaza de España was the center of political power in Guam for over 200 years during Spanish, American, and Japanese occupation, it remains an important heritage site for the people of Guam. As a result, the Plaza de España is listed on the U.S. National and Guam Registers of Historic Places and the site continues to play significant roles in Guam's history as a venue to memorialize and celebrate social and civic functions, including the inauguration of the Governor of Guam.

Executive Summary

The Guam Preservation Trust presents this *Plaza de España* Management Plan that will involve the shared responsibility of Guam's community. The management of the Plaza de España will focus on the preservation and conservation of heritage resources that are present on the grounds of the Plaza de España as well as promote Guam's heritage tourism through the program's enterprise.

It is the Guam Preservation Trust's intention, through our mission of preserving and protecting Guam's historic sites, to establish a management policy for Plaza de España and educate and to build the capacity of our community so that they become true advocates and stewards of our heritage resources on Guam.

Vision

Historic preservation on Guam is a public responsibility that is shared through education, cooperation, and advocacy all linking to Guam's cultural heritage.

Mission

The Guam Preservation Trust will preserve and protect Guam's historic sites, culture, and perspectives for the benefit of our people and our future. The Guam Preservation Trust also seeks to engage with the community and instill active heritage tourism on historic sites. Mission and Executive Summary could be combined.

Goals

- The Guam Preservation Trust will coordinate with various community organizations to ensure the preservation and restoration of the historic Plaza de España as it was during the transition from Spanish to American administration.
- 2. The Guam Preservation Trust will promote traditional and contemporary activities compatible to restoring the Plaza de Espana to its historical prominence as the premier outdoor space for events in the capital of Hagatna.
- 3. The Guam Preservation Trust will develop compatible educational awareness and outreach programs for the Plaza de España to help the community appreciate the roles of the Plaza de España and events that transpired at the site in Guam's history from pre-Spanish times to contemporary Guam.
- 4. In an effort for visitors to appreciate the Plaza de España, The Guam Preservation Trust will promote heritage tourism on Guam by initiating programs to build capacity of historians, student-scholars, and other writers in the interpretation and presentation of historic properties for public education and appreciation by both domestic and international visitors through the Plaza de España.
- 5. The Guam Preservation Trust will engage and promote a strong conservation and preservation program with communities and organizations to sustain and maintain the Plaza de España.
