GUAM PRESERVATION TRUST

(GPT) was created as a nonprofit public corporation in 1990 by Public Law 20-151, and is governed by a Board of Directors.

It is dedicated to preserving Guam's historic sites and culture as well as educating the public about those issues. Although primarily tasked with restoring historic structures, which are listed in the Guam Register of Historic Places and/or the National Register of Historic Places, GPT also funds various types of cultural preservation projects.

The Board of Directors consists of 10 members representing 5 fields of expertise:

- Archaeology
- Architecture
- CHamoru Culture
- History
- **Community Planning**

There are two members in each field (primary and alternate capacities). Board members appointed by the Governor to Guam Historic Preservation Review Board and confirmed by the Guam Legislature, who then are automatically members of the Trust's Board.

COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS

The Guam Preservation Trust has partnered with over 50 public, private, and individuals from the community to oversee 14 grants and to accomplish proposed outcomes (goals) for this year. All have been successful in their respective delivery to the community for their benefit and appreciation.

During Fiscal Year 2021 the Guam Preservation Trust Board of Directorsapproved funding \$235,489 for grants and projects. A total of \$247,562 was awarded to GPT from local, national and federal granting institutions for the following programs: 500 Years of Our Journey; I Hinanaota; Ekungok I Estoriata Project, Atantano Heritage Preserve;, and the I Hinanaota Exhibit.



\$750,000 \$740,000 \$720,000 \$710,000 \$790,000 \$690,000 \$680,000 REVENUE EXPENDITURES \$2020 \$2021 The Guam Preservation Trust receives most of its revenues from the Building Permit Fees administered by the Guam Department of Public Works. For Fiscal Year 2021 a total of \$559,523 was collected from building permit fees which resulted in a slight increase of 1% from the FY 2020 total of \$505,005. The increase is partly due to an increase in construction activity in 2021.

Interest income on investments increased slightly between FY2020 and FY2021. In FY2021, \$141,922 was earned on interest income, compared to \$141,585 in FY2020. The slight increase is due to the increase of rates and investments during the fiscal period.

Total Investment for FY2021 is \$1,464,172, an increase of \$648,908 compared to FY2020 total of \$815,264. This increase is due to the increase in revenues for the Guam Preservation Trust.

PBS University Higher Learning- Start the new year as we join our partner PBS Guam in launching Ekungok I Estoria-ta on public television! Series I and II will be broadcasted from January thru Mes CHamoru.

Professional Development for CHamoru Teachers - GPT will provide professional development on the Ekungok I Estoria-ta series with educators for series II and explain how place-based learning can assist in growing appreciation of our sacred sites and assist with its preservation.

GPT Strategic Plan- Join us as we envision the next 5 years of advancing heritage preservation through 2027.

Pacific Preservation Summit- Our island will once again host the Pacific Preservation Summit with a focus on technology uses in preservation.

Archaeology Mini-Courses- Building the success of our training courses in 2021, these courses will keep our community engaged and knowledgeable on archaeological methods.

Atantano Rare Plants Out Planting- GPT's Atantano Preserve will be the site of a project with UOG and USFWS to outplant rare plants which will increase the number of these and provide the public an opportunity to learn about these plants.

Archaeology Month October – Our Archaeology Committee is committed in bringing this awareness to the public during October. Look for fun activities and learning opportunities brought to our community from those practicing right here in Guam.

Hila'an Conservation Easement - In keeping with the mission of the Guam Preservation Trust to preserve and protect Guam's historic sites and perspective for the benefit of the people of Guam, the opportunity to save significant historic properties in Hila'an is proposed by the Hila'an landowner (Polaris Guam LLC) with partnership and assistance from the Department of Defense's (DOD) Readiness Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) program.

FQ Sanchez Elementary School- GPT remains hopeful that legislative solutions will bring about the funding necessary to being this project and restore a treasured site in the village of Humatak.



Guam Historic Courthouse- With GPT support, our Judiciary will have completed the design work to restore the historic courthouse whose structure which can tell the story of design from early pioneer architects to Guam post 1945 and the places of important judicial rulings were made.

Guam Rock Art- Our community will be able to see the work of archaeologists conduct the documentation of ancient rock art found in Guam. Let's see what our ancestors were inspired about and wanted us to see through the clues they left behind.

Atantano Master Plan- Through a grant from the US DOI Office of Insular Affairs, a conservation and cultural resources plan will be completed to create the overall Atantano Master Plan.



CHALLENGES

FUNDING for rehabilitation and restoration work will be GPT's greatest challenge in the year ahead.

Recent passage of PL33-66 reduced GPT's revenue source (DPW permit fees) by 50%. By this action GPT will be faced with limited funding for grants and projects.

Projects currently in queue include the rehabilitation of the FQ Sanchez facility, the repairs of Agana Cathedral Basilica Bell Tower, the restoration of the Rosario House in the historic district of Hagatna, and the George Flores and Jose San Nicolas in the historic district of Inalahan.
