1.0. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Michael Makio at 3:26 p.m., and roll call was conducted.

2.0. APPROVAL OF MINUTES (Sept 6, 2019 meeting)

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion on the minutes of September 6, 2019.

Motion

With no changes Rebecca Duenas motioned to approve the minutes as read. Dave Lotz seconded the motion and with no further discussion the motion was unanimously approved.

3.0. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Chairman Makio recessed the general board meeting and entered into Executive Session.

Executive Session was adjourned and the general board meeting reconvened at 3:55 p.m.

4.0. OLD BUSINESS

4.1. Architecture Book of Guam

Joe Quinata reported GPT entered into an agreement with Jack Jones co-authored with Andrew Laguana to conduct research and produce an Architecture Book for Guam documenting historical architecture on Guam.

Staff obtained quotes for the printing of 200 books totaling \$6,678.00. The quote did not include layout fees.

The Board discussed the use of the book as a resource in providing historical information from an architectural perspective, the sale and distribution of books, and on-line access.

Motion

With no further discussion Dave Lotz motioned to approve the proposal as presented by the staff with provision that an analysis is done and presented at the next meeting on the evaluation to use as a sale item and access on electronic media.

The motion was seconded by Vince Leon Guerrero.

Joe Quinata will obtain clarification on the copyrights.

With no further discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the printing of 200 books.

4.2. Marianas Island Testing & Training (MITT)

Chairman Makio updated the Board on a meeting with Senator Kelly Marsh, Senator Sabina Perez, Senator Talena Nelson, and representatives of the Navy.

The meeting resulted in positive feedback. In moving forward the members agreed to 1) conduct a review of the proposed MITT training program; and 2) avoid making commitments and concession until stakeholders have had time to review the reports. Subsequent meetings were to be scheduled to review the outcomes.

The proposed MITT agreement was received and a meeting was scheduled at the Hilton and attended by Senator Kelly Marsh, Carlotta Leon Guerrero, SHPO Patrick Lujan, Dave Lotz, members of the buildup office, several Navy personnel two of which were the primaries with the MITT, and GPT represented by Michael Makio, Dave Lotz, and Joe Quinata.

Discussions included the revisions to the programmatic agreement, focus in making preservation efforts more robust, and off-shore training.

Dave Lotz clarified under the National Historical Preservation Act, the area affected extends 12 miles from the shore.

The current MITT is not a consolidated agreement with the Northern Marianas and CNMI wanted to remain under a separate agreement.

The draft has been vetted through the Governor's Office, Lt. Governor, and their legal counsel.

Senator Therese Terlaje has scheduled an oversight meeting to be held on Tuesday, December 10th at 5 p.m. and invited the GPT staff to attend.

The Board discussed GPT's assertive action and any rights to monitor.

4.3. World Heritage Training and Workshop Opportunities

Joe Quinata presented the program booklet for the upcoming World Heritage Training and Workshop Opportunities session for Board's review.

The Training will be held on December 3rd and 4th, followed by the SHPO's workshop on the 5th and 6th.

The overall event is funded by the Office of Insular Affairs, and the Historic Preservation Fund under the National Park Service.

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Staff requested the Board's support in funding \$500.00 to host the evening welcome reception for the participants on Monday, December 2nd.

Motion With no further discussion, Rebecca Duenas motioned to approve \$500.00 for the gathering of the attendees. The motion was seconded by Dave Lotz.
With no objections, the motion unanimously carried.

4.4. Humatak Revitalization Plan

Joe Quinata reported AIA has completed the Humatak Revitalization Plan.

The plan was presented and well received by the Humatak community.

Staff requested Board's approval of \$2,740.00 to print 100 copies of the completed plan for distribution to the Governor, Legislature and Humatak Community.

The Board discussed increasing the number of copies to 200.

Motion With no further discussion, Dave Lotz motioned to approve funding the printing of 200 copies of the Humatak Revitalization Plan based on the proposal presented.
The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas.
With no further discussion the motion unanimously carried.

The Board discussed the Ft. Santo Angel and the Old San Dionisio Ruins.

5.0. NEW BUSINESS

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion on New Business resulting from the Executive Session.

Motion Eric Forbes motioned to award each employee a performance bonus equivalent to one (1) pay check effective on the next payday.
The motion was seconded by Rebecca Duenas.
With no further discussion, the motion was unanimously approved.

6.0. COMMITTEE REPORT

6.1. Budget & Finance Committee

Joe Quinata presented the current fund balance of \$1,585,391.72 with a total obligated fund of \$4,428,687.90. A total of \$156,703.82 is reserved for projects in queue.

The Board reviewed completed grants & projects and de-obligating unused balances.

With no further discussion, Eric Forbes motioned to de-obligate a balance of \$9,894.00 for the 2018 Grants Budget; \$11,589.16 for the Pacific Heritage Youth Summit; \$10,000.00 for the Pacific Preservation Summit; and \$289.12 for the CHamoru Language Competition.

The motion was seconded by Dave Lotz.

With no further discussion, the motion was unanimously approved.

6.2. Architecture Committee

Action Joe Quinata reported the San Nicolas and the Rosario drawings have been completed and will schedule a meeting for the committee to review and approve the submittals.

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6.3. Grants Committee

Joe Quinata reported the next grant cycle deadline is January 6, 2020.

A few grants have been submitted.

6.4. Archaeology Committee

-Joe Quinata reported the archaeological training course is still pending.

-The Board discussed hosting an outreach event upon receipt of the report on the San Dionisio ruins from the Spanish archaeological team.

7.0. OPEN DISCUSSION / ANNOUNCEMENTS

- SHPO Patrick Lujan met with Joe Quinata to discuss a) combining the Strategic Plan for both entities; b) adopt a historic site program which will include a creative training program for guidelines of preservation methods to maintain historic sites.

-Joe Quinata presented an update on the Hila'an site.

-Joe Quinata presented an update on Magua village.

Meetings have been held with Al Borja to clarify both the indoor and outdoor interpretive plans. A meeting is scheduled for December 12th to finalize the plans.

-Joe Quinata reported staff visited the Atantano site and identified as Site 2 in the MARS archaeological survey.

Board members expressed an interest in visiting the site.

-Joe Quinata announced the confirmation hearing date for Nicole Calvo and Dave Atienza is scheduled for December 5, 2019. Board members were encouraged to support and attend.

8.0. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further discussion, Rebecca Duenas motioned to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Vince Leon Guerrero and with no objections, the meeting adjourned at 3:25 p.m.
