1.0. CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Makio at 3:15 p.m. and roll call was conducted.

2.0. APPROVAL OF MINUTES (January 14, 2016 Meeting)

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion on the minutes of January 14, 2016.

Motion With no discussion or amendments, Rebecca Duenas motioned to approve the minutes as read. The motion was seconded by Joaquin Perez and unanimously approved. Chairman Makio requested that minutes be made available a week prior to the scheduled Board meeting.

3.0 OLD BUSINESS

Info 3.1. Adoption of GPT Regular Board Meeting Date
Joe Quinata reported the results of the Board poll regarding changing the Regular Board meeting day. Two Board members responded Thursday's were inconvenient. The Board reached a consensus to conduct the meetings every second Monday of the month at 3:00 p.m.

4.0. NEW BUSINESS

Info 4.1. National Trust for Historic Preservation Partnership Meeting; Washington, D.C.; March 7-9, 2016
Joe Quinata reported the 2016 NTHP Partners Retreat is scheduled for March 7-9, 2016, in Washington, D.C. The retreat is conducted for the Executive Directors of the various Preservation Partners to engage in dialogue with key staff of the National Trust, discussing common issues and concerns with other Partners, as well as attending advocacy training, briefings, and lobbying with Congressional leaders.

5.0. COMMITTEE REPORTS**5.1. Budget & Finance Report**

Joe Quinata presented a financial outlay of GPT's cash flow for the remaining calendar year. The Board discussed GPT's financial position, obligated funds, time line of estimated revenues, and anticipated expenditure for projects (i.e., the construction of the Chargualaf, Lujan, and Meno Homes, FQ Sanchez Facility, and the Historic Structures Report for the Archbishop Flores House).

The current fund available for grants and projects is \$541,475.34.

5.2. Architecture Committee Report

Committee Chair Michael Makio reported the results of the bids for the Chargualaf, Lujan, and Meno Homes.

GPT has 90 days to award and submit letters of intent to the contractors.

Joe Quinata met with the contractor to identify cost savings.

The committee recommended awarding the contracts subject to the availability of funds and obtaining all the necessary signatures from the owners.

FQ Sanchez Facility

Committee Chair Michael Makio reported RIM Architects has completed the A&E plans. The committee recommended soliciting for construction bids subject to the availability of funds. No action was directed.

5.2.a. Agana Cathedral Basilica Bell Tower – Archbishop Anthony Apuron

Committee Chair Michael Makio reported the committee identified the costs that meet the criteria for preservation funding. Only the bell tower repairs were historically relevant. The project will be placed in queue and will be addressed when funds are made available.

Guam Legislature

Joe Quinata reported a change order was submitted by Architects RNK for an extension of Construction Administration Services. The Change Order will be at no cost to GPT and will be absorbed by the Guam Legislature. GPT serves as the Construction Manager and will require approving any action that will affect the overall construction costs.

Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion on the change order.

Motion

With no further discussion, Marilyn Salas motioned to approve the Change Order for the contract alterations to include the Furniture, Fixtures, and Equipment (FFE), for the Guam Legislature so long as the costs associated are carried by the Guam Legislature. The motion was seconded by Joaquin Perez and unanimously approved.

Committee Chair James Viernes reported the committee met and discussed the state of GPT's financial outlook and the impact on GPT as a result of the recent legislation.

At the consensus of the Grants Committee, James Viernes motioned to place a temporary moratorium to place a cap of \$5,000.00 for each grant in light of the current fund situation. The motion was seconded by Cacilie Craft.
With no further discussion the motion was unanimously approved.

Committee Chair James Viernes reported the committee discussed concerns about the feasibility of the project, clarification on the site, and obtaining the proper approvals from the landowner and military.
The committee recommends to table the project until the applicant is able to provide a response to the concerns.

Committee Chair James Viernes reported the committee discussed concerns of the grant's overall historical content, accuracy, acknowledging of other compelling research contrary to the narrative, the approach, and cost.
Chairman Makio opened the floor for discussion.
The committee recommended not funding the project at this time.

Committee Chair James Viernes reported due to an oversight of the initial review of the application, the committee revisited the application in its entirety to include a curriculum program.
Committee Chair James Viernes motioned to approve \$4,270.00 for the Curriculum Program of the Project with the condition that funding for the Workshop Program is not issued until the Curriculum Program is completed.
The motion was seconded by Marilyn Salas. With no further discussion, the motion was unanimously approved.

Joe Quinata will prepare a draft which will include historical information and community input on highlights and memories of the building.
- 6.2. Memorial Garden Concept Design**

The Board discussed the relationship with the University of Guam and outturn of graduates in the disciplines related to preservation.
Staff will schedule a meeting to discuss the post and secondary courses at the University of Guam.


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- Chairman Makio announced the APIA conference is scheduled for April 5-6, 2016, in Stockton, California. The Board will revisit GPT's participation in the upcoming event.
 - Marilyn Salas encouraged Board to visit the Guam Museum website if interested in assisting in their fundraising efforts.
 - Lynda Aguon reported the Manenggon nomination has been submitted in hopes to be approved in time for the Guam Liberation festivities.
 - Legal Counsel Terrence Brooks announced the George Flores property has been closed and is now the property of the Guam Preservation Trust.
 - Lynda Aguon reported the Repository was not be funded by Congress as specified in the Programmatic Agreement.
- Joe Quinata reported a letter was submitted requesting a meeting to discuss alternative solutions.

Motion With no further agenda items, Marilyn Salas motioned to adjourn the meeting. Cacilie Craft seconded the motion. With no objection, the meeting adjourned at 5:05 p.m.

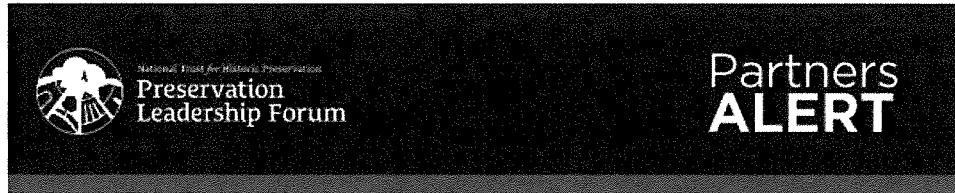
