Subject: Guam Preservation Trust Funds

We are in receipt of your memorandum dated September 6, 1990, in which you requested information on the following:

REQUEST NO. 1: Does P.L. 20-151:13 require a legislative appropriation before Guam Preservation Trust funds can be expended?

ANSWER: No.

REQUEST NO. 2: Who is the custodian for all Guam Preservation Trust funds?

ANSWER: The Board of Directors of the Guam Preservation Trust.

REQUEST NO. 3: Is the Board of Directors of the Guam Preservation Trust authorized to expend the funds generated pursuant to P.L. 20-151:13?

ANSWER: Yes.

STATEMENT OF FACTS:

P.L. 20-151:12 enacted Government Code (GC) Section 13985.80 which established the Guam Preservation Trust (the Trust) as a nonprofit public corporation.

p.L. 20-151:8 enacted GC Section 13985.61 which provides, in part, that the Board of Directors of the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board shall also serve as the Board of Directors of the Trust.

P.L. 20-151:13 enacted GC Section 13985.82 which mandates the use of fines collected under GC Section 13985.25 and collected building permit fees for the benefit of the Trust. The fees are the main source of income for the Trust.

The Director of the Bureau of Budget and Management Research is uncertain as to whether or not a legislative appropriation is needed to authorize the expenditure of Trust funds, and he is requesting our assistance in resolving this issue.

DISCUSSION:

GC Section 13985.61(5) [P.L. 20-151:8] states that the Guam Historic Preservation Review Board will also serve as the Board of Directors of the Trust, a nonprofit public corporation.

GC Section 13985.80 [P.L. 20-151:12] provides that the Trust shall have the power:

[T]o seek outside grants and donations, to acquire title in fee simple, in leasehold, or by easement, through donation, transfer, dedication, purchase, and eminent domain, of threatened Guam properties for the preservation of their historical value, and support other activities directly related to increasing the public appreciation of and benefit from historical places. Expenditures by the Trust shall be limited to purposes of the Trust....

GC Section 13985.82 [P.L. 20-151:13] provides that building permit fees collected pursuant to GC Section 31047(a) and fines collected under GC \$13985.25 will be sources of income for the Trust. GC Section 13985.82 further provides that "Guam Preservation Trust funds shall be maintained separate and apart from all other government funds."

It is a well established principle of corporate law that a corporation's board of directors is solely responsible for the management and use of a corporation's assets and funds. 18B Am. Jur. 2d Corporations §§ 1484 and 1495. Thus, the Trust's Board of Directors is the custodian for all income that is generated for the benefit of the Trust, and Trust funds can be expended only upon authorization of the Trust's Board of Directors.

Therefore, it is our conclusion that all income generated for the Trust, including those fees collected pursuant to GC Section 13985.82 [P.L. 20-151:13], can be expended for the purposes of the Trust only upon a duly enacted resolution of the Board of Directors of the Trust; no legislative appropriation is required for such expenditures.



BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

The Legislature has determined that the historic preservation program of Guam can be enhanced by making the Guam Historic Preservation Officer a classified position, thereby providing continuity in establishing and carrying out programs that will enrich and protect Guam's historic sites and properties. It has also been determined that the burden of actively preserving Guam's cultural resources must be shared by both government and private resources. It is therefore the purpose of this Act to provide the mechanism necessary to strengthen and improve Guam's historic preservation laws and programs for the benefit of the people of Guam.

Section 2. \$26030 is hereby added to Chapter I, Title XXVII, Government Code, to read:

hereby created the Guam Historic Resources Division created. There is hereby created the Guam Historic Resources Division within the Department of Parks and Recreation, which division shall be responsible for establishing a comprehensive historic preservation program for Guam."
